



What We Do

VRC is a two fold program. Initially VRC provides vocational hands on training to at risk adult youth. The program consists of 50 community service hours to be completed by an at risk participant referred to us. The participant will produce a functional and safe vehicle under the supervision of a certified master mechanic. During our program the participant will complete life coaching hours using the Adult Needs and Strengths model. We provide better options to the participant that may not have been present before participating in our program reducing at risk behavior and recidivism rates. Our mission brings benefit to the community as a whole through individual lives.

After the participant produces a functional and safe vehicle it will be donated to a sponsored recipient exhibiting need in our community. A vehicle is an essential part of an independent self-sufficient life. We provide this independence free of charge to the recipient in hope to help foster self-sufficiency. Our staff will also mentor the recipient making goals and assisting with any need that may have previously been a road block to our recipients.

Participants

- Vocational hands on training with an ASE certified master mechanic.
- Provides accomplishment, pride in giving, and confidence in ones self.
- Using the ANAS model we work on opening doors that may not have been an option before participation.
- VRC works hard to avoid recidivism of our participants by developing a plan of action to address areas in life that have proven challenging in the past.
- We develop relationships and trust with our participants. As part of a fully completed program with VRC the participant will interact with us 6, 12, and 18 months after completion.

Recipients

- A tangible asset is produced and donated to further our mission of improving lives in our community.
- Recipients are sponsored and demonstrate a need that is met by VRC.
- Improves our recipients ability to function with efficiency within the community.
- We provide life coaching to the recipients to support and encourage self-sufficiency.

Community

- Working to reduce the 60% or higher recidivism rates in Ohio costing residents \$24,000 or more per year per inmate. Annually Ohio spends approximately \$1.2 Billion housing incarcerated persons.
- Reducing the tremendous victim cost monetarily and socially per offense within the community.
- VRC uses donations to meet a multi-purpose mission benefiting the community in the front end and back end of the program.
- We meet the demand of local organizations need for vehicle donation. We complete this task with a greater purpose while freeing the resources needed to complete this task in house.
- VRC promotes independence of our recipients and participants within the community supporting less cost to community programs.
